**Lecturer or Assistant / Associate / Full Professor – Clinician Scientist

St. Michael's Hospital Department of Medicine is seeking a qualified full-time academic general internist. The successful candidate must be eligible for a clinical academic appointment at the rank of Lecturer or Assistant, Associate or Full Professor at the University of Toronto and will hold an academic position description of clinician-scientist. The candidate's research will be in the area of health services and policy, with a specific focus on general internal medicine and the use of big data to support health system improvement. The candidate should have demonstrated leadership potential and strong system-level thinking with the ability to collaborate across disciplines. The expected start date of the position is July 1, 2018.

Candidates must hold an MD degree and should have, or be eligible for, certification in Internal Medicine by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO). A graduate degree relevant to clinical research or equivalent, and a proven academic record of clinical research are strong prerequisites. The candidate will report to the Head, Division of General Internal Medicine at St. Michael's Hospital. This Division, comprised of 17 full time academic internists, has an international reputation in clinical research, education and quality improvement. A successful candidate must have proven clinical excellence in various aspects of general internal medicine, including acute inpatient care, ambulatory care and perioperative medicine. Demonstrated achievement in teaching and education are strongly desired. The successful candidate will be eligible for a Scientist position within the Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute. Preference will be given to individuals with an interest and demonstrated excellence in carrying out research, as demonstrated by publications in leading journals, presentations at significant conferences, awards and accolades.
