

Dr. Mahesh Raju Award for Mentorship 2018

Terms of Reference

The Canadian Society of Internal Medicine (CSIM) is offering up to two awards per year in recognition of mentorship.

The CSIM is pleased to announce these awards in appreciation of the contributions made by **Dr. Mahesh Raju**. Dr. Raju planned the Atlantic Region Internal Medicine Meeting for many years, is a CSIM past-president, holds a CSIM Osler Award and is a long-time member and supporter of the CSIM.

ELIGIBILITY: Award One

One award for a resident in recognition of mentorship of junior resident colleagues.

- CSIM Resident Associate (R4 or R5 as of June 15, 2018) enrolled in a residency program in Atlantic Canada (R3s accepted into a GIM program are also eligible).
- Consideration will be given to the applicant's work and contributions in fostering collegiality amongst residents, teaching junior trainees, and demonstrating leadership in the areas of medical education, research, and/or community outreach.

ELIGIBILITY: Award Two

One award for a physician in recognition of mentorship of residents and dedication to internal medicine.

- Physician practicing in Atlantic Canada.
- Consideration will be given to the applicant's work and contributions in fostering collegiality amongst residents, mentoring trainees, and demonstrating leadership in the areas of medical education, research, and/or community outreach.
- Consideration will be given to the applicant's dedication to IM / GIM in Canada.

THE AWARDS

- The award will consist of a certificate and a monetary prize of \$500.
- The awards will be presented during the CSIM Annual Meeting October 10-13, 2018 in Banff, Alberta.
- The recipients will also receive complimentary registration to attend the CSIM Annual Meeting and a travel grant of up to \$500 to help defray the travel and accommodation costs of attending the meeting in Banff (receipts required).
- The recipients will be invited to join the CSIM Education Committee.

The application package must include the following:

1. A cover letter from the nominator outlining the mentorship qualities exemplified in the nominee.
2. For resident nominees: a letter from the program director only if he/she is not the nominator.
3. One letter of support from a resident colleague.
4. The applicant's current curriculum vitae.

Please send application documents as separate attachments with consistent file names (i.e.: CV John Smith 2018.pdf; Support Letter for John Smith 2018.pdf, etc.)
