Position Description

The Department of Medicine of McGill University invites applications for a full-time Clinician Scientist position as a member of the Contract Academic Staff at the rank of Assistant Professor (Clinical). The research focus of this role is in medical obstetrics. This position does not confer eligibility for tenure.

The Department of Medicine is a leader in academic medicine. Our educational and research missions support excellent and innovative clinical programs across our teaching hospitals. Within the Department, the McGill Division of General Internal Medicine is committed to the pursuit of excellence in clinical care, research, and medical education. Its mission includes as a priority the strategic recruitment of outstanding sub-specialists committed to academic medicine.

This position will be based at the Jewish General Hospital (JGH), one of McGill's major teaching hospitals, located in the vibrant and multicultural city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec. The JGH Division of General Internal Medicine is a dynamic group of sub-specialists supporting the JGH's mandate to provide high-quality patient-centered care. We have excellent programs in clinical care, medical education, quality improvement, and research. We lead in the care of patients with acute and complex medical disorders, with focused clinical programs in perioperative and thrombosis medicine. The JGH Division is committed to building a medical obstetrics program to add to its clinical and academic missions, and to grow the medical obstetrics program within the McGill Division.

Job Duties

As a Clinician-Scientist, the successful candidate will devote 35% of their time to clinical activity, 15% to teaching, and 50% to research. Clinical duties include contribution to the Division's inpatient services on clinical units and consultation services as well as developing and formalizing a clinical inpatient and outpatient consultation program in medical obstetrics. Startup funding including a research stipend may be available to a suitable candidate allowing for protected research time.

The candidate is also expected to be actively involved in all aspects of McGill's academic mission (teaching and supervision of clinical trainees and graduate students, research, and involvement in academic and administrative committees) and will be expected to demonstrate

a commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion in these activities. McGill faculty members are expected to contribute to service activities within their units, the University, and the wider scholarly community.

Qualifications and Education Requirements

Candidates must hold an MD degree and must have completed subspecialty training in General Internal Medicine for which they are certified by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. They must also hold or be eligible for medical licensure in Quebec and certification by the Collège des médecins du Québec. This position requires advanced clinical and research training in medical obstetrics.

All candidates must be fluent in English with a working knowledge of French.
