Position Description

The Department of Medicine of McGill University invites applications for a full-time position as a member of the Contract Academic Staff (Clinical) as a clinician teacher at the rank of Assistant Professor.

The McGill Division of General Internal Medicine is highly committed to the pursuit of excellence in clinical care, research and medical education. Its mission includes as a priority the strategic recruitment of outstanding sub-specialists committed to academic medicine.

The MUHC Division of General Internal Medicine is a dynamic group of sub-specialists supporting the MUHC's mandate to provide high-quality patient-centered care. Our focus is on the care of patients with acute and complex medical disorders including the care of patients throughout the perioperative period and patients with medical disorders of pregnancy. We practice across the MUHC teaching hospital network. We also provide on-site and telehealth sub-specialty support to the northern communities in Nunavik and Eeyou Istchee. We have excellent programs in clinical care, medical education, quality improvement, and research.

The Department of Medicine is a leader in academic medicine, our educational and research missions support excellent and innovative clinical programs across our teaching hospitals. The MUHC is one of McGill's major teaching hospitals affiliated with the Faculty of Medicine at Canada's internationally renowned McGill University, located in the vibrant and multicultural city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec.

Job Duties

As a clinician-teacher, the duties will include 50-70% clinical activity, 15-25% teaching, and 5-25% of research and/or administration. Clinical duties include a commitment to inpatient services on teaching units and consultation services across the MUHC network, as well as to outpatient clinics in preoperative, obstetrical medicine, and complex care.

The candidate is also expected to be actively involved in all aspects of McGill's academic mission (teaching and supervision of clinical trainees, graduate students and involvement in academic and administrative committees) and will be expected to demonstrate a commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion in these activities.

Qualifications and Education Requirements

Candidates must hold an MD degree and must have completed subspecialty training in General Internal Medicine by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada; have, or be eligible for, medical licensure in Quebec and certification by the Collège des médecins du Québec; and have obtained further advanced training in medical education with a focus on residency and program evaluation.

All candidates must be fluent in English with a working knowledge of French.
