The successful candidate will be an academic visionary and have excellent strategic thinking skills. The candidate will preferably hold or be eligible to hold a full-time clinical academic appointment at the rank of Associate or Full Professor at the University of Toronto. The effective start date is January 1, 2023 or shortly thereafter.

The successful candidate will hold an MD degree and should have, or be eligible for, certification in Internal Medicine by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO).
