Skills Required:

An aspirational leader is sought to drive change and advance the academic enterprise of the Division of General Internal Medicine. The ideal candidate will be an internationally respected scholar and visionary leader with sophisticated interpersonal skills. S/he will meaningfully engage the academic leadership of the University and the affiliated teaching hospitals to build strong cross-department and cross-discipline collaboration, bridge diverse groups, strengthen capacity in research across disciplines, and provide strong mentorship to trainees and faculty at all stages of career. The individual will establish an overarching vision and strategic direction for the Division.

The successful candidate will have the ability to work within an interdisciplinary team at multiple sites, demonstrate academic and clinical leadership experience as well as strong organizational skills. The successful applicant must be licensed to practice medicine in Ontario and hold (or is eligible for) certification by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada; be eligible for or be a member of the Canadian Medical Protective Association. Additional formal training in General Internal Medicine is an asset.

The successful candidate should demonstrate academic success in leading research programs and developing junior faculty and as well clinical leadership. The successful candidate must be eligible for a University of Ottawa academic appointment at the rank of Associate Professor. Fluency in both official languages (French and English) is an asset.

Job Duties:

The successful applicant is accountable to the Chair/Head of the Department in fulfilling the mission, vision and goals of the Department, the Hospital(s) and the Faculty, in particular as they relate to the Division. The Division Head holds a joint appointment as the Head of the Division (academics) and the Head of the Division (clinical services).

The Division Head is part of the leadership team of the Department of Medicine. As such, the Division Head will work with hospital(s) and faculty leadership. This is a combined role including clinical services, administrative responsibilities and opportunity for research activities.

Additional Details:

The Ottawa Hospital (TOH) is the largest academic health center in Canada with over 1,100 beds, approximately 12,000 staff and annual budget of over \$1.2 billion. It also has the distinction of being the Capital's primary health services provider covering a health region of hospitals and care providers spanning over 20,000 km². The Division of General Internal Medicine is a Division within the Department of Medicine partnered with the University of Ottawa, The Ottawa Hospital, the Ottawa Hospital Research Institute, Bruyère Continuing Care and Montfort Hospital.

The Division of General Internal Medicine provides exemplary care to patients with a wide variety of medical conditions in Ottawa, Eastern Ontario, West Quebec and Nunavut. It focuses on the care of complex and acutely ill patients both in the ambulatory care and in-patient settings and excels in the provision of perioperative medicine and obstetric medicine.

The division continuously develops ongoing expertise in end of life care, addiction medicine, liver disease and other fields of care. It also excels academically in clinical teaching, medical education, data base research and QI based research. In addition, the division also has a robust Clinical Scholars program. The Faculty of Medicine is a nationally recognized leader, ranked among Canada's top-tier medical faculties. The 2020 CWTS Leiden Rankings list the Faculty as 5th in Canada for impact with more than 10% of biomedical and health science papers being published in the top 10% of their field.

The University of Ottawa is the largest bilingual (English-French) university in the world and the only bilingual medical school in Canada. The Faculty and its affiliated research institute partners are second in Canada by Maclean's magazine for research intensity; second highest growth rate in Tri-Council Funding (all programs) since 2003; and third highest growth rate in Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) funding for universities with medical schools since 2003.

The Ottawa Hospital Research Institute (OHRI) is TOH's research arm. It ranks third out of more than 600 Canadian hospitals for competitive, peer-reviewed grants from the prestigious Canadian Institutes of Health Research. OHRI houses over 2,200 researchers, publishing more than 1900 studies yearly, with hundreds being high impact publications (top 10% or citations) and places 5th overall in Canada for research funding. Over the past five years, Department of Medicine members were responsible for \$165 million received in peer-reviewed funding and in the past year, over 800 department research studies were published in peer-reviewed journals.
