

GIM FACULTY RESEARCH and QUALITY IMPROVEMENT SHOWCASE 2018

TERMS OF REFERENCE

The *GIM Faculty Research and Quality Improvement Showcase* is a venue to highlight new and innovative research by Canadian General Internists. CSIM members are invited to submit recent findings from studies (especially randomized clinical trials, observational studies, QI studies, or systematic reviews) that provide new insights and are relevant to General Internal Medicine.

Eligibility:

This Showcase is intended for CSIM Full Members (in good standing). Senior trainees in GIM (PGY6 or higher) who are CSIM Resident Associates are also encouraged to apply.

CSIM Resident Associates (PGY1-5) should submit their research to the postgraduate trainee research competition (visit www.csim.ca for details).

The following items are eligible for submission:

- Findings from studies that are in preparation for submission to a journal in 2018.
- Findings/studies which are in press or under review at a journal as of July 15, 2018.
- Studies which were published in a journal **after** December 1, 2017.
- Research that is presentation/submission ready, as of July 15, 2018.

Process:

A selection committee will review the abstracts and select up to three abstracts for oral presentation at the CSIM Annual Meeting October 10-13, 2018 in Banff, AB (*specific date to be determined*). Please note that presenters are responsible for their own registration fees and travel expenses.

Application:

If you wish to apply, please submit a structured abstract (maximum 300 words) including background, objectives, methods, results, interpretation along with two learning objectives addressed by the abstract; [click here for information on developing learning objectives](#).

We also invite you to consider submission of your research/quality improvement project to the *Canadian Journal of General Internal Medicine* ([CJGIM](#)).
