



# CALL FOR CLINICAL ABSTRACTS TERMS OF REFERENCE

A clinical vignette is a concise presentation of a unique, unusual, or complex clinical problem in the management of which the trainee has played an active role. It should summarize the admission complaint or symptoms, relevant history, physical and laboratory findings, tentative diagnosis, diagnostic investigation, treatment, and outcome.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- This competition is open to residents enrolled in a postgraduate residency training program (PGY1 to PGY5) in Internal Medicine (IM) or General Internal Medicine (GIM) in Canada at the time of submission.
- The competition is also open to medical students currently enrolled in a faculty of medicine in Canada at the time of submission.
- Applicants must be a CSIM Resident or Medical Student Associate, or a Medical Student or Resident Member of the ACP Ontario Chapter.

If you are not a member or associate as described above, you MUST complete an application to join the <u>CSIM</u> or <u>ACP</u> BY May 21, 2024. Applicants who are not approved members or associates in good standing of either association will have their abstracts rejected.

### **SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Abstracts must present a clear, concise summary of a unique clinical case.
  - Abstracts must be submitted in English and be no more than 350 words (excluding learning objectives).
  - Abstract topics must be IM- or GIM-related.
- 2. Submissions must include one or two learning objectives. A learning objective states what an attendee will be able to do or do better as a result of viewing the presentation or poster. Objectives are action-oriented and begin with verbs such as *recognize* or *diagnose*. Click here for information.
- 3. **The abstract title must <u>NOT</u> reveal the diagnosis**. The abstract must be structured so that the final diagnosis is **not** disclosed until the point in the case presentation at which the diagnosis was actually made.
- 4. A case may be submitted only once by any one of the project authors. All correspondence regarding the submission will be sent only to the submitter.
- 5. Do <u>not</u> include city/province, hospital name, co-authors, initials, references, introductions, historical data, literature reviews, bibliographies or financial support details in the submission. Images and graphs may not be included in the abstract submission but may be included (fully anonymized) in the presentation or poster.
- 6. Abstracts must <u>not</u> include any potentially identifying patient information. **Prior to submitting the abstract,** please review the <u>Guidelines for Anonymizing Abstracts</u>.
- 7. Individuals may submit <u>up to two</u> abstracts across both abstract competitions (Research/QI and Clinical); however, <u>only</u> one oral may be presented and <u>only</u> one poster may be presented across both competitions.
- 8. Abstracts submitted to or presented at other national or international meetings are eligible for submission.
- 9. Abstracts are <u>not</u> eligible for submission if the work has been published as a full paper in a peer-reviewed journal prior to the submission deadline.

#### **ABSTRACT REVIEW**

- 10. The abstract will be reviewed as submitted. Abstracts cannot be edited or revised after submission. Grammar, spelling, etc. will <u>not</u> be checked nor edited prior to review. Any identifying information (such as city, province, hospital, etc.) will be removed to blind your abstract.
- 11. A review panel will evaluate each abstract for eligibility and content.
- 12. Applicants will be notified of results by late summer.

#### **SELECTED ABSTRACTS**

- 13. All co-authors of selected abstracts will be required to complete a Conflict Disclosure form.
- 14. Selected abstracts must include a list outlining all the conflicts, or lack thereof, of all co-authors (either on the poster or as a presentation slide.)
- 15. Copies of original investigations presented in slides/posters (photos, pathology slides, radiographs, echos etc.) must be anonymized.
- 16. The name, city and university of only the submitter will be included in the listing of posters and/or the program and may also be acknowledged through the CSIM and ACP websites, e-newsletters, and/or social media. Co-authors may be acknowledged on the poster/slides.
- 17. Only the submitter may present the abstract (co-presenters are not included in the presentation).
- 18. All presenters accepted for oral or poster presentation must register at the posted rates for the CSIM/ACP Ontario Chapter Annual Meeting October 16-19, 2024 in Hamilton, ON.
- 19. Abstracts presented will be published in the <u>Canadian Journal of General Internal Medicine (CJGIM)</u>; authors may opt out of publication. Authors may be contacted by the CJGIM about submitting the abstract as a full manuscript.

#### **PRIZES**

- 20. The top three winners in each category will receive a cash prize.
- 21. **ACP Ontario Residents or Students Only:** One eligible\* winner from the Ontario Chapter (across all abstract categories of oral presentations) will be invited to participate in the poster competition at the <u>ACP IM Meeting in New Orleans</u>, April 3-5, 2025 and will be eligible to receive a travel grant of up \$1,500 CAD to present their poster. (\*Must be a current ACP Resident/Fellow or Medical Student member in the Ontario Chapter with dues paid in full. The travel grant cannot be brought forward to future years; no substitutions of presenters; if the winner cannot attend, the prize is forfeited; the cash equivalent is not provided if the winner cannot present; winner must meet the ACP National Abstract Competition Guidelines).
