

GIM RESEARCH-IN-PROGRESS VIRTUAL SEMINAR

Terms of Reference 2022

The GIM Research-in-Progress Seminar will provide up to five Early Career Investigators or trainees in GIM the opportunity to present an ongoing project and receive feedback from a panel of early career and senior researchers as part of an interactive virtual workshop.

TERMS

- This opportunity is available to CSIM Full Members (in good standing) who are Early Career Investigators, having held full-time faculty appointment in Canada for a period of up to 10 years (cumulative and excluding leaves of absence) (e.g. faculty appointment that provides eligibility to apply for grants and/or supervise trainees).
- Trainees in a GIM/IM residency program (PGY4 or higher) may also apply; trainees must be CSIM Resident Associates ([click here](#) to join).
- Eligible research-in-progress projects must be GIM-related.
- Applications will be reviewed by a selection committee.
- Selected authors will make a short presentation during the session (scheduled to take place on March 29, 2022 at 12:00pm Eastern Time via Zoom), followed by a discussion and feedback period.

1. A description of your project (maximum 300 words) including background, objectives, methods, results, interpretation.
2. In your cover email, please briefly summarize your project and what you would wish to learn during this session.
